Sung to: "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star"

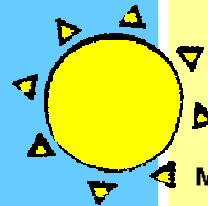
Circle, rectangle, triangle, square;
