



Spider Web Game

Recommended for Ages 4 +

What you will need

Tape – Painters tape or masking tape would work best because it can be removed easily.

Something light in weight – Cotton balls work great, feathers, or you can also use something like balled up dryer lint or an old dryer sheet.

The set up

In a doorway or a hallway use the tape to make your spider web. If the child is younger you might want to make it closer to the ground, especially if you want them to help. Do not worry about the shape, that is not important. You can make it any shape you like. Here is an example:





How to play

For a basic game that will help with hand and eye coordination, have the child throw something light to get it caught on the web on the sticky side.

For older kids, you can set goals such as trying to hit specific parts of the web or through different gaps. You can even design the web to have smaller or larger gaps to make things more difficult depending on the goals.

You can make up your own rules. The point is to have fun and work on motor skills and coordination.
