



Art Circles

Inspired by Abstract Artist Wassily Kandinsky

Recommended for Ages 5 – 8

Wassily Kandinsky was a famous abstract artist who created wonderful pieces of art with vibrant colors and shapes. Create your own Kandinsky-inspired circle art with jar lids, our template, and your imagination.

Materials needed:

- 1. White paper (8 ½ X 11 inches or larger)
- 2. Template provided or a jar lid (2 inches or smaller)
- 3. Crayons, colored pencils or markers
- 4. Scissors and printer (if utilizing template)

Instructions:

- 1. Carefully fold your paper in half horizontally.
- 2. Fold your paper one more time to create four panels. Ensure that your corners are neatly matching up to create a perfect rectangle.
- 3. Fold one more time and open up your paper. You should have 8 perfect rectangles.
- 4. Using the template or jar lid, trace out a circle in the center of each panel. Use any color you desire and color it in as pictured above.
- 5. Draw two more rings around your circle in different colors. Play with different colors and use your creativity.
- 6. Shade in the rest of the rectangle with a complimentary color.
