LA County Library Offers Free Flu Immunization Clinics at 13 Libraries This Fall

In Partnership with the LA County Department of Public Health, Clinics will be Held October 14 through November 10

Flu season is here. To help you stay healthy, LA County Library is partnering with the LA County Department of Public Health for the eighth year in a row to offer free flu immunization clinics at community libraries throughout the county in the months of October and November. Last year, 2,500 free flu immunizations were given. No appointment or insurance is required.

According to the CDC, flu vaccination prevented an estimated 7.52 million illnesses, 105,000 hospitalizations, and 6,300 deaths due to influenza during the 2019-2020 season. Because the flu is highly contagious, immunizations not only protect the person who gets the immunization, but also reduces the risk for their family, co-workers, and other close contacts. Flu immunizations are recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older, including healthy adults. Pregnant women, children, adults 50 years of age and older, and immunocompromised individuals are especially susceptible.

Getting a flu immunization this fall is more important than ever with the flu and COVID-19 circulating at the same time in communities throughout LA County. Catching both flu and COVID-19 infections is possible and could result in increased illness.
